



Information Regarding Staff Compensation

In compliance with Texas Government Code §659.026, Alamo Colleges is providing the following information.

1. Number of full-time equivalent employees (FTE) employed.

2,478.53 FTE as of September 1, 2016.

2. Amount of legislative appropriations to the agency for each fiscal year of the current state fiscal biennium.

- FY 2017: \$64.3 million.
- FY 2016: \$64.4 million.

3. Methodology, including any employment market analysis, for determining the compensation of executive staff employed by the agency, along with the name and position of the person who selected the methodology.

Alamo Colleges' Board of Trustees negotiates and approves the Chancellor's employment contract. College president compensation is periodically reviewed relative to large, urban comparator community colleges (Austin, Dallas, El Paso, Houston, Lone Star, San Jacinto and Tarrant) to ensure competitiveness of base pay, defined as between the second and fourth ranking colleges for president pay. Vice chancellor pay is set at the same level as college presidents. This methodology was adopted by the Board of Trustees.

4. Whether executive staff are eligible for a salary supplement.

No. Executive staff pay is not supplemented by gift, grant, donation or other consideration as described by *Texas Government Code §659.0201*.

5. Market average for compensation of similar executive staff in the private and public sectors.

Based on data in the Texas Association of Community Colleges FY 2016 salary survey, the average base pay for chancellors at Alamo Colleges' peer institutions was \$321,485. The average base pay for college presidents at the four peer institutions who reported president pay was \$206,416. Market data for similar positions in the private sector is not available.

6. Average compensation paid to employees employed by Alamo Colleges who are not executive staff.
